Council Ward Boundary Changes – There is a Community Governance Review underway at the moment, part of which concerns the boundaries of the parishes surrounding Calne. This has come about following a proposal to form a new parish of Derry Hill and Studley. If this were to go ahead, the question arises of what happens to the rest of Calne Without (the parish that currently includes Derry Hill and Studley). One proposal involves adding parts of Calne Without to adjoining parishes. Under the proposal areas including Lower Compton

Council Tax Precept 2022-2023

In March 2020 the precept that the Parish Council receives as part of the council tax paid on each property was increased from £8,000 to £11,000. This represented an increase for a band D property from £22.60 per year to £31.06 per year. At that time the Parish Council publicised its intention to carry out a further increase in March 2021 from £11,000 to £16,000 or £45.23 per year for a band D property. Details of the reasoning behind the cost increase were delivered to each property in the parish and residents were invited to comment on the proposed increase. Eighteen responses were received, fifteen (83%) were in favour of the increase to £16,000, one (6%) in favour of a lower increase and two (11%) were against the increase.

Due to the effects of the Covid-19 pandemic, and the variety of impacts this had across society, it was agreed that the planned increase in March 2021 should not take place and the precept was therefore held at \pounds 11,000.



This year it has been decided to increase the precept by a smaller amount to £15,000. This represents an increase to a band D property of approximately £11.30 from £31.10 (2021/2022) to approximately £42.41 (2022/2023) per year.

These funds will allow the Parish Council to continue their activities, such as maintaining the Tommy Croker Memorial Playing Field and helping to replace worn out equipment when required, providing and servicing additional rubbish and dog waste bins, and cutting and maintaining rights of way (when not undertaken by WCC).

The following are a few of the items planned for the coming year.

• Further discussions with WCC regarding school traffic on Middle Lane and hope to arrive at a solution to help mitigate the impact of this.

• Bridleway clearing and maintenance along Lymers Lane.

• Fixing potholes and improving the condition of the roads in the parish, particularly the large potholes at the corner of Marsh Lane and Oliver's Hill.

• Work in conjunction with the Cherhill Village Hall Committee to provide a permanent War Memorial and Memorial Woodland in Cherhill.
